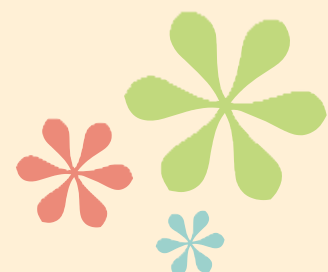

## Visit to IIPM, Dehra Dun

On February 08, Grade IX A, IX B had the opportunity to visit Indian Institute of Petroleum, one of the leading constituent laboratories of CSIR, which was established in Dehra Dun in 1963. The IIPM is headed by the Director Dr. M.Garg.

The students were taken to various laboratories where they were shown how crude oil was refined and petrol, LPG and Lube Oil was extracted from it. The students realized the need to preserve the environment and conserve the natural resources. This educational trip was very informative, as valuable lessons in preservation of ecology need to be learnt early in life.

## Visit to Indian Institute of Petroleum

On February 8, 2012 the students of Grade XI A, IX A & IX B with three teachers visited the Indian Institute of Petroleum. We were divided into two groups and were escorted by their staff to different labs – Distillation lab, Biotechnology lab, Biomass lab etc. In the distillation lab, we saw the samples of some crude oil which was being extracted, the distillation of the oil into petrol, diesel, kerosene, wax etc. This visit of ours was very informative and educative too. ## Visit to Survey of India, Hathibarkala

On February 10, 2012 Grade VII A & VII B went for an educational excursion to Survey of India. The students were escorted by three teachers. It was established in 1767. We saw the process of making 3 dimensional maps. They make 95% maps for Army (defence) and remaining 5% for general people like road maps, political maps etc.

The process of making maps was divided into four steps: 1) Photo section 2) Retouching section 3) Plate making section 4) The Final printing section. In the photo section, a very huge pin hole camera called KLIMSCH COMMODORW was installed which was made in Germany. It can enlarge upto 10 times and reduce upto 5 times. In the retouching section, they make the corrections that are needed. Then in the plate making, grained plate, sensitised plates, inked plates are made. The plate is then ready for printing. In the printing section, the final print is taken. Heidelberg printing machine is a machine which can print 11,000 papers per hour. The Printing room is one of the biggest rooms in Asia and has three units, feeding unit, printing unit and delivery unit. We had learnt a lot from this trip and hope in future we have many more trips like this.

## Visit to Forest Research Institute

We visited Forest Research Institute on February 07, 2012. When we reached the pleasant campus of FRI, a guide came and gave us a brief history of FRI. It was built in 1929 and designed by Mr. Bloom Field. The buildings of FRI are made of lime powder and 'surkhi'. FRI spreads over an area of 1200 acres. The architecture of FRI is a mixture of Roman and Greek style.

We visited 6 museums in FRI. The first museum was about soil. It had information about soil erosion and its causes. The methods to prevent soil erosion were also provided, the second

museum was on forest pathology. There were samples of certain diseased plants that were infected by micro organisms like bacteria. We also got to know the symptoms of diseases in plants and their prevention. The third museum was the museum of the Social Forestry. Here we were informed about the advantages of the trees and bamboo. There were handmade materials and furniture made of bamboo on display.

The fourth museum was all about Silviculture. It was about how we use timber and also about perperemes that

were made from a wood called 'Pandanus Bectarius'. The next museum was timber museum. There were around 126 kinds of wood from all over India. The last museum was the non-wood forest museum. Here we got to know about things which a forest provides, other than wood. We also visited the information center to know about architecture and products made out of wood during the time of British rule.

It was an enlightening trip and our knowledge about FRI was enriched.

## UWS Girls Performed Outstandingly in 'Duke Tip Test'



UWS girls have done us proud again. Six girls of Class – 7 took the Duke Talent Identification Program above level Test sponsored by USA's Duke University along with several other students all over the country on November 27, 2011 after scoring 99 percentile and above, in the ASSET Diagnostic Test taken in August 2011. The results were announced on January 12, 2012.

All of them have been awarded with a

Certificate of recognition for their performance. They have also qualified for DUKE TIP Independent Learning online workbook course with a mentor, which will be available to them all year-round. The performance of Kyeong Seon Cheon (Alicia) is worth mentioning. She is one among the 1330 students who has scored 90 percentile and above. Apart from the privileges mentioned above she has also secured for herself a

place in a three week long residential workshop to be held on the Infosys Global Education Center Campus in Mysore from May 12 to June 3, 2012. She has also qualified for the Duke Tip Interactive, Instructor led studies summer program. She will get an exclusive package of newsletters and educational brochures from Duke University.

## Inter Disciplinary Class Presentation

The Inter Disciplinary Class Presentations are designed with an aim to give the students a chance to apply their knowledge and develop them into their skills. A topic is chosen by a class and then it is approached through various disciplines like languages, sciences, applied sciences, Geography, Sociology, Mathematics. This is an effective learning process which reinforces the knowledge that they have acquired and promotes better learning and understanding of the curriculum. The interdisciplinary field crosses traditional boundaries between academic disciplines. This makes them not only well versed with what they have learnt but they also get to show case their presentation skills, laying full stress on team work and co-operation. These presentations made an extensive use of multimedia.

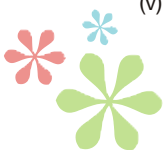

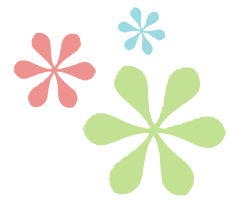
The Unison Group is a living testimony to his indomitable will, single-minded dedication and unrelenting commitment to his goals.
